THE CHURCH NEEDS MORE LIBERAL CHRISTIANS

Now that I have your attention please read on before you form a mob against the preacher. Liberal has become the modern day equivalent to calling someone a Samaritan. Never is it a term of endearment but always one of contempt. It is a term thrown around to classify people and/or congregations that have “gone too far” and are on the verge of falling or have already fallen head long into apostasy. But liberal is not always a bad thing, in fact there are times when it would be ungodly not to be liberal. I believe there are times when Jesus looks upon His bride and wishes she were more liberal.

Recently I have been doing a lot of painting at the parsonage and as I was painting one room “Nomadic Desert”, there was also a second room that was to be painted the same color. As I was finishing up the first room I began to realize that if I didn’t get conservative with the application of the paint I would run out and Sherwin Williams was closed. So, when I started on the second room I applied the paint very conservatively, and to make an already long story short, conservative didn’t get the job done. The next day after the paint had dried it was so thin and blotchy that I had to go to Sherwin Williams and pretty much repaint the entire room.

In like manner, conservative in some areas of Christianity does not get the job done. We absolutely must be conservative or even dogmatic when it comes to what we teach and practice because all we do must be authorized by Christ (Colossians 3:17). To go beyond the teaching of Christ and His chosen apostles is to alienate ourselves from God (2 John 9) and God’s word is invalidated when human wisdom supersedes God’s wisdom (Mark 7:9-13). However, this commitment to conservatism should not permeate all aspects of Christianity.

Christians should never be conservative with their love towards others especially the household of God. Love should be applied so liberally that it runs...

...everywhere and a handful of paper towels is needed to wipe up the mess [painting metaphor – I’m quite messy]. Conservation of love is an annoying and pointless noise (1 Corinthians 13:1). All too often for the sake of doctrinal correctness love is thrown out the window and replaced with bulging veins and pointing fingers. Jesus said that love for one another would be a visual indicator of our fidelity to Him (John 13:34-35). Paul wrote that we are to speak the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15). We don’t have to compromise the truth, we don’t have to stretch the truth, nor do we have to keep silent about the truth, but simply speak it in an attitude of love. The apostle John lets us know that without love we have no clue who God is (1 John 4:7-8). He also lets us know that due to our love for our fellow Christians we know we have entered into life (1 John 3:14). The kind of love that is applied liberally not only through the good and easy times but through wrongs suffered, feelings hurt, character attacked, and names hurled. For it is through this kind of love that we show ourselves to be children of our heavenly Father (Matthew 5:45).

So be liberal, roll out Christ-like love in abundance and don’t worry about the mess!
